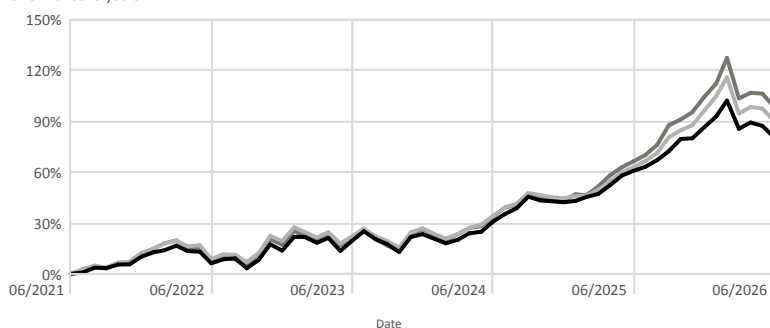
Northstar FR Equity Fund is a general equity portfolio that aims to provide investors with high long-term capital growth.

INVESTMENT POLICY

The portfolio's net equity exposure will be a minimum of 80% of the portfolio's asset value. The portfolio's investment universe consists of equity securities, preference shares, property shares and property related securities, notes, non-equity securities, interest bearing instruments and securities as well as assets in liquid form. The portfolio may invest in participatory interests or any other form of participation in portfolios of collective investment schemes or other similar collective investment schemes. The portfolio may from time to time invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments. The manager may also include forward currency, interest rate and exchange rate swap transactions. For the purpose of this portfolio, the manager shall reserve the right to close the portfolio to new investors in order to manage the portfolio in accordance with its mandate.

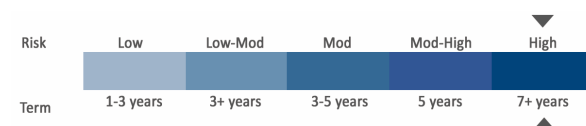

MARKET PERFORMANCE REVIEW

Global equities delivered strong returns during the second quarter of 2026, with the MSCI World Index rising 13.9% as investor sentiment improved following easing Middle East tensions, normalising oil prices, and a more favourable interest rate outlook. Emerging markets continued to outperform developed markets, returning 24.1%, with Emerging Markets ex-China gaining an impressive 34.6%. Performance was led by Korea (+88%) and Taiwan (+49%) as investors rotated back into AI-related technology stocks amid renewed optimism towards the sector.

Commodity prices weakened noticeably during the quarter. Oil prices retreated 38% from their peak of USD120 per barrel following the signing of the memorandum of understanding between Iran and the United States, easing concerns over potential supply disruptions. Precious metals also came under significant pressure, with gold declining 14%, silver 20%, and the broader platinum group metals (PGM) complex approximately 20%, as investment flows into the debasement trade moderated over the quarter.

Despite the improvement in global sentiment, South African equities retreated during the quarter. The MSCI South Africa Index declined 1.7% in US dollar terms, while the JSE Capped ALSI Index fell 2.4% in rand terms. Although diversified miners continued to benefit from firm base metal prices, the Resources sector was weighed down by sharp declines in precious metals and energy stocks, reversing much of its strong first-quarter performance. Year-to-date, the Resources sector is down 12% in rand terms, with precious metals declining more than 20%. In contrast, South African Industrials and Financials delivered positive returns, gaining 4.8% and 8.3%, respectively, over the quarter.

FUND'S QUARTERLY PERFORMANCE

The Northstar FR Equity Fund declined 2.6% (net of fees) during the quarter, marginally underperforming the JSE Capped ALSI Index, which returned -2.4%, and the ASISA South African Equity General peer average, which returned -2.5%.

Performance was supported by positive attribution from our materials exposure, primarily driven by our underweight position in gold and PGM equities, as well as strong contributions from several industrial holdings, including Richemont (+28%), AB InBev (+18%), WBHO (+15%), Premier (+10%) and AECI (+10%). Offsetting these gains were our underweight positions in MTN (+20%) and Capitec (+17%), together with our overweight exposures to Clicks (-21%) and Prosus (-8%).

Although South African Industrials and Financials outperformed the Resources sector during the quarter, consumer-sensitive companies, to which the fund has meaningful exposure, continued to struggle as the lingering effects of Middle East tensions and elevated inflation weighed on household spending and investor sentiment. While this detracted from performance over the quarter, we believe these areas of the market offer attractive medium-term investment opportunities as valuations remain compelling.

POSITIONING AND EXPECTATIONS

Volatility remains elevated as the Middle East conflict continues. While this has created headwinds for several sectors, particularly consumer discretionary, financials and resources, it has also presented attractive investment opportunities.

During the quarter, we took profits in several Rand hedges, diversified mining and industrial holdings following their strong recovery and redeployed capital into areas of weakness by increasing our exposure to Naspers/Prosus and selectively adding to gold and PGM equities. While we remain underweight gold equities, we have increased our PGM exposure to a broadly neutral position and are now overweight Naspers/Prosus, where we continue to see compelling long-term value supported by attractive prospective returns.

While the duration and ultimate implications of the Middle East conflict remain uncertain, we remain disciplined in applying our investment and valuation framework and will continue to actively rotate capital as opportunities emerge.
